



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
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
## DIAGRAM OF ORGANISATION FOR PROJECT BEIHAI, CHINA

### Mission Statement:

The company's goal is to combine and advocate traditional Chinese medicine with best western medical knowledge, by developing top quality wellness centers including hotels, hospitals and universities in China and abroad, all working together in synergetic fashion.

## Company Goals and Objectives:

The Company plans to develop these centers in 5 separate locations in China as well as additional locations abroad. The goal is to become the leading provider of wellness and healing facilities using these combined methods.

The first project is being developed in Beihai City, China, Guangxi province, including one university, one major hospital, a separate outpatient clinic, one 5+ star hotel/wellness facility, two 4 star hotels, as well as pharmaceutical herbal production facilities, all adhering to the best international standards.

Within the first three years, the hotel/wellness center, the university and the hospital are expected to be operational. The other hotels as well as the herbal production facility will also be in the building stages within that time frame.

## **Business Philosophy:**

The overall goal is to provide the best service to our clients, who will be our medical graduates from the university as well as guests and patients who come to be helped.

The services and facilities will be marketed primarily to medical doctors who want to further their education to include traditional medical knowledge and also to people worldwide who need medical help, who have not received satisfactory help within the modern western medical system.

There are primarily two health systems in the world. A health system comprises all organizations, institutions and resources devoted to producing actions whose primary intent is to improve health. Most national health systems include public, private, traditional and informal sectors. The four essential functions of a health system have been defined as service provision, resource generation, financing and stewardship. The two systems have different ways to approach the patient. Both work reasonably well in most cases.

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One system is the traditional medicine system. Traditional medicine refers to health practices, approaches, knowledge and beliefs incorporating plant, animal and mineral based medicines, spiritual therapies, manual techniques and exercises, applied singularly or in combination to treat, diagnose and prevent illnesses or maintain well-being.

Countries in Africa, Asia and Latin America use traditional medicine (TM) to help meet some of their primary health care needs. In Africa, up to 80% of the population uses traditional medicine for primary health care. In industrialized countries, adaptations of traditional medicine are termed "Complementary" or "Alternative" (CAM). TM has maintained its popularity in all regions of the developing world and its use is rapidly spreading in industrialized countries.

- In China, traditional herbal preparations account for 30%-50% of the total medicinal consumption.
- In Ghana, Mali, Nigeria and Zambia, the first line

of treatment for 60% of children with high fever resulting from malaria is the use of herbal medicines at home.

WHO estimates that in several African countries traditional birth attendants assist in the majority of births.

- In Europe, North America and other industrialized regions, over 50% of the population have used complementary or alternative medicine at least once.
- In San Francisco, London and South Africa, 75% of people living with HIV/AIDS use TM/CAM.

70% of the population in Canada has used complementary medicine at least once.

- In Germany, 90% of the population has used a natural remedy at some point in their life. Between 1995 and 2000, the number of doctors who had undergone special training in natural remedy medicine had almost doubled to 10 800.
- In the United States, 158 million of the adult population use complementary medicines and according to the USA Commission for Alternative and Complementary medicines, US \$17 billion was spent on traditional remedies in 2000.
- In the United Kingdom, annual expenditure on alternative medicine is US\$ 230 million.

The global market for herbal medicines currently stands at over US \$ 60 billion annually and is growing steadily.









The other system is usually referred to as 'modern medicine'. Modern medicine is the science and art of maintaining and restoring human health through the study, diagnosis, and treatment of patients.

The modern practice of medicine occurs at the many interfaces between the art of healing and various sciences. Medicine is directly connected to the health sciences and biomedicine. Broadly speaking, the term 'Modern Medicine' today refers to the fields of clinical medicine, medical research and surgery, thereby covering the challenges of disease and injury, focusing often on symptoms and the treatment of symptoms.

### **Current situation in China:**

China has one of the longest recorded history of medicine records of any existing civilization. The methods and theories of traditional Chinese medicine have developed for over two thousand years. Western medical theory and practice came to China in the nineteenth and twentieth centuries, notably through the efforts of missionaries[2] and the Rockefeller Foundation, which together founded Peking Union Medical College. Today Chinese traditional medicine continues alongside western medicine and traditional physicians, who also receive some western medical training, are sometimes primary care givers in the clinics and pharmacies of rural China.

Although the practice of traditional Chinese medicine was strongly promoted by the Chinese leadership and remained a major component of health care, Western medicine was gaining increasing acceptance in the 1970s and 1980s. For example, the number of physicians and pharmacists trained

in Western medicine reportedly increased by 225,000 from 1976 to 1981, and the number of physicians' assistants trained in Western medicine increased by about 50,000. In 1981 there were reportedly 516,000 senior physicians trained in Western medicine and 290,000 senior physicians trained in traditional Chinese medicine. The goal of China's medical professionals is to synthesize the best elements of traditional and Western approaches.

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In practice, however, this combination has not always worked smoothly. In many respects, physicians trained in traditional medicine and those trained in Western medicine constitute separate groups with different interests. For instance, physicians trained in Western medicine have been somewhat reluctant to accept "unscientific" traditional practices, and traditional practitioners have sought to preserve authority in their own sphere. Although Chinese medical schools that provided training in Western medicine also provided some instruction in traditional medicine, relatively few physicians were regarded as competent in both areas in the mid-1980s.

The extent to which traditional and Western treatment methods were combined and integrated in the major hospitals varied greatly. Some hospitals and medical schools of purely traditional medicine were established. In most urban hospitals, the pattern seemed to be to establish separate departments for traditional and Western treatment. In the county hospitals, however, traditional medicine received greater emphasis.

Traditional medicine depends on herbal treatments,

acupuncture, acupressure, moxibustion (the burning of herbs over acupuncture points), and "cupping" of skin with heated bamboo. Such approaches are believed to be most effective in treating minor and chronic diseases, in part because of milder side effects. Traditional treatments may be used for more serious conditions as well, particularly for such acute abdominal conditions as appendicitis, pancreatitis, and galistones; sometimes traditional treatments are used in combination with Western treatments.

It is the company's goal to form an organized system in education and in actual practice to combine the best of both these systems to provide a result that will greater than the sum of it's parts.

## Company Background:

Under the name of CHINA MEDICAL CULTURE WEEK the State Administration of Traditional Chinese Medicine of the People's Republic of China has established a powerful organization in 2006, fully backed by the Government, to promote Chinese Traditional Medicine into the world main stream.

The program is probably best explained by quoting from the General Program:

"All the programs of China Medical Culture Week are developed focusing on 'revelation, spread and popularization'. In terms of area, it could cover any region in China and abroad. It takes Chinese medicine as the core and involves many fields including science, technology, history, culture, education, industry, agriculture, plantation, farming processing, tourism, medical treatment, healthcare and so on. In terms of time, it traces from the ancient time to the current area".




The General Program states that 5 (five) China Medical Culture Cities are planned to be set up in China.

Beihai is the first of the 5 Medical Culture Cities and at a meeting at the end of June 2007 in Beihai at the invitation of the City of Beihai the discussions centered around.

- Building a University for Traditional Chinese Medicine (postgraduate for Medical Doctors from all over the world)
- Building of hospitals for Traditional and Modern Medicine (also attracting the medical tourism which presently goes to Thailand and India)
- Herb production facilities (they were saying that within a few years 1'000 plantations in China from sea level up to Tibet would exclusively produce for this project, establishing a strong brand name with world wide recognition)
- Luxury Hotels and Resorts (attracting wealthy foreigners and domestic clients to be pampered and taken care of by a medical teams)
- Commercial Complex (shops, restaurants etc.)

For the implementation of this program China Medical Culture Week has set up and authorized a subsidiary, which has entered into a Chinese-Foreign Contractual Joint Venture with a newly established Hong Kong Company, our company, Fort Group Investment LTD.







## 主要任务:

公司通过在中国及海外开发一流的健康养生中 心,包括酒店、医院和大学,来实现中医与西医的 结合并加以推广的目标。

## 公司宗旨和目标:

公司计划在中国五个不同地, 以及国外其它地 方开发建设保健养生中心。目标是成为中西医结合 及健康养生技术领域的领头羊。

首批項目正在中国广西北海市进行,其中有大 学、高级医院、独立门诊、超五星级酒店及健康养生 中心、两家四星级酒店以及中草药厂。

三年内。酒店/健康养生中心、大学和医院预计 可以建成运营。酒店、中药制药厂也会在预期进行 建设。

## 经营理念:

公司的总目标是, 为我们的宾客、医学专业毕 业生以及需要帮助的客人和病人提供最好的服务。 病人以西医技术得不到满意疗效时,从我们提供传 统的中医技术中得到很好的治疗。我们通过大学传 授传统中医知识, 培养中西医结合的医疗技术人才, 把服务推向世界。

世界上主要有两个卫生系统。所谓卫生系统 即包括致力于产生以改善健康为主要目的行动的 所有组织、机构和资源。大多数国家卫生系统包 括公立、私立、传统和非正规部门。卫生系统的 四个基本职能已被定界为提供服务、资源产生、 供资和管理工作。这两个系统有不同对待病人的 方法,但在大多数情况下都各具效果。

一种系统是传统医学系统。传统医学是通过 单独或综合使用动植物及矿物药物、精神治疗、 手法技术及体育锻炼来治疗、诊断、预防疾病、 保持健康的健康医护、方法、知识及信仰的统一。

非洲、亚洲、拉丁美洲运用传统医学帮助满 足这些国家主要健康医疗的需要。在非洲、达到 80%的人口主要运用传统医学治疗疾病。在工业 化国家, 传统医学被称为"补充疗法"或"替代 疗法"。传统医学在发展中国家被广泛的应用并 且在工业化国家迅速开来。

- 在中国,传统草药占全部医药消耗的30%-50%。
- 在加納、马里、尼日利亚和赞比亚,60%因疟 疾而发高级的儿童最初的治疗是在家用草药治 疗。
- 世界卫生组织估计,在一些非洲国家,大部分 的接生工作是由传统的接生医生做的。

- 在欧洲、北美和其他工业化的地方,超过50%的人 口至少用过一次补充疗法或替代疗法。
- 在洛杉矶、伦敦、南非,携带有HIV病毒或患有爱 滋病的人用补充疗法或替代疗法。
- 在加拿大有70%的人至少使用过一次补充疗法。
- 在德国,90%的人在他们的使用天然药治疗。在 1995-2000年间在天然药物医学方面受过特别训 练的医生人數已将近达到10800。
- 在美国、1亿5千8百万成年人使用补充疗法、根据 美国补充疗法和替代疗法委员会得知,2000年美 国在传统医学上的花费有170亿美圆。
- 在英国、每年的传统医学的支出是2亿3千万。
- 每年全球投入到草药医疗的费用有600亿美圆而且 还在稳步增长。

另一种系统通常被称为"现代医学"。现代医学 是一种通过对病人的研究、诊断及治疗来维持和恢复 人类健康的科学。

现代医学行为是建立在医术与各种科学相交的界 面上产生的。医学与健康科学和生物医药有着直接的 联系。一般来说,在今天"现代医学"这个词涵盖了 临床医学领域、医学研究领域和手术领域,是对疾病 和伤痛的一种挑战,注重于症状及其治疗。
